

# Pine and Hardwood Differences

## Pine Shelving

- Pine is made using finger joints.
- Pine contains wood filler where pine knots have broken or come out.

## Pine Towers

- Pine tower sides have grooved slots for shelf pins (on adjustable shelves) to sit in. Note: These do not have finger joints.
- Pine tower bottoms are secured to tower sides using cam screws and nuts.

## Drawers

- Pine has cam screws and nuts to hold drawer together
- Pine drawer bottoms are made of 1/4" composite material.
- Pine has full extension drawer slides.

## Supports

- Pine has wood supports to hold shelf weight. These supports also have metal J-Hooks that are screwed into them to hold closet rods.

## Closet Rods

- Pine systems come with Powder Coated (gray) metal rods.

## Hardware

- Pine has metal hardware to connect shelves to each other and to walls.

## Colors

- Pine comes in Honey Maple and Red Mahogany colors.

## Origin

- Pine is made in China and shipped to Missouri; then shipped to client.

## Warranty

- Pine has a one year Manufacturer's Warranty.

## Hardwood Shelving

- Hardwood is made of continuous pieces of wood (up to 10 feet in length).
- Hardwood contains no wood filler.

## Hardwood Towers

- Hardwood tower sides have 5mm holes for shelf pins to fit into.
- Hardwood tower bottoms are secured to tower sides using screws.

## Drawers

- Hardwood has dovetail construction to hold drawer together.
- Hardwood drawer bottoms are made of 1/4" birch plywood.
- Hardwood has full extension drawer slides.

## Supports

- Hardwood has wood supports to hold shelf weight. There are additional wood supports that both support the shelf weight and hold the closet rods.

## Closet Rods

- Hardwood systems come with the choice of wood rods or metal rods in Satin Nickel or Chrome finish.

## Hardware

- Hardwood connects shelves to each other and to walls using wood supports.

## Colors

- Hardwood can be left natural or stained at the factory to match trim, furniture, etc.

## Origin

- Hardwood is made in USA and shipped or delivered to client.

## Warranty

- Hardwood has a one year Manufacturer's Warranty.
